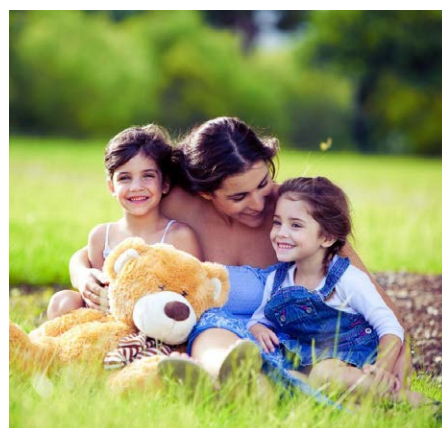

Provide education and information to adult participants regarding their children. Please note that our shelter is open 24/7. Bachelor's degree in human service field, equivalent combination of experience and education may substitute for education. Two years experience in a social service agency.

Bilingual Life Skills & Nutrition Coach:

This is a part-time position (16 hrs/wk). Position schedule: Sunday & Monday 10:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. This position ensures the day to day operation of our emergency shelter kitchen, utilizing the community contributions program with participants. Employee will use holistic model to support participants in healthy meal preparation, maintaining a clean and healthy cooking environment, and gardening skills, while being mindful of possible triggers related to domestic abuse. Bilingual (English/Spanish) required. High School Diploma or equivalent and 2 years of relevant experience.

Bilingual Center Assistants: We currently have on-call positions available. Our on-call staff provide coverage on an as-needed basis with no set schedule or guaranteed hours. Please note that our shelter is open 24/7. Center Assistants

Volunteer Needs

Crisis Advocate Volunteers: As a crisis advocate volunteer you will answer crisis calls, assess safety of callers, assist in clarifying needs, issues and concerns, provide referrals for local resources and screen for entry into our programs. Crisis Advocate volunteers will receive training on procedures and protocol. We are currently seeking assistance for two day and one evening shift between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Children's Program Bilingual Volunteer: We are in search of a bilingual volunteer to help with our children's program on Tuesday evenings 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. You will assist the Child and Family Case Coordinator with the healthy relationships lesson plans and projects.

Voices Against Violence Center Assistant: Duties include: answering the phone, monitoring the entrance, and some light admin duties and special projects. The schedule is flexible; we could use assistance anytime time during the work week.
